- Take special care if you have to use first-aid equipment.
- Only one person allowed in the clubhouse at any given time.

Appendix B

MANOR PARK BOWLING CLUB PHASE 2A GREEN OPENING

IN ORDER TO KEEP ALL OUR MEMBERS SAFE THE FOLLOWING RULES MUST BE FOLLOWED BY EVERYONE TAKING PART IN A CLUB COMPETITION.

- Each player is responsible for taking all necessary precautions to keep themselves safe. Social distancing should be maintained at all times
- It is recommended that each player has a container of sanitising liquid with them whilst playing in a competition.
- Locks should be sanitised before and after being handled along with any surrounding handles, etc.
- You should refrain from touching the railings surrounding the green.
- As the bowling green is in a public park you are requested to maintain social distancing with people in the park.
- Entering the clubhouse should only be when completely necessary. Only one person in the clubhouse at any time.
- All personnel entering the clubhouse must follow the rules for sanitisation that are displayed on the door.
- If a coin is used at the start of the match it must only be handled by one player.
- Each player to use own jack. One can be used from the clubhouse, sanitising it before and after use.
- If possible players should use their own mat and only they can touch the mat and move it around the green.
- Measuring should be avoided. However if a player has their own measure it can be used but only they can handle it. If agreement cannot be reached the end is void
- Scoring does not have to be recorded on a club card, any form of recording is acceptable. Whichever method is used the record must only be touched by one player. Cards can be taken from the clubhouse but this will entail carrying out full sanitising procedures as outlined on the door to the clubhouse. Each player should bring their own pen and paper ready to act as marker.
- Players must bring their own drink as no refreshments will be available from the clubhouse.
- Results should be sent to the competition organiser by phone/email. There is no requirement to submit a card.
